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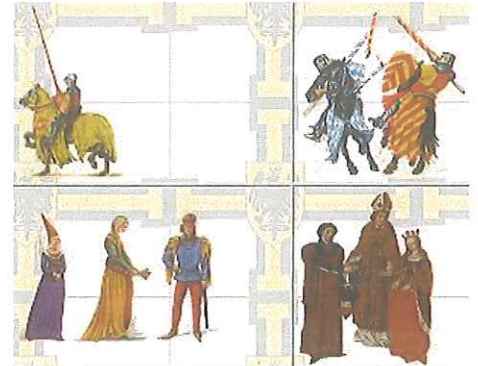




# Costumes

**Dress in your finery and participate in the spirit of medieval times!**

Students, teachers and volunteers are encouraged to dress in medieval era costume. In addition, each class will be choosing their king and queen in the coming weeks.



A few costume suggestions for those not chosen to be king or queen are:

Royalty: princes or princesses in brightly colored gowns or robes with crowns

Holy Orders: monks in brown cloaks with hoods and rope belts or popes with white robes

Knights/Squires: simulated armor with helmets, swords, shields and capes

Manor Lords: long jackets with felt hats

Ladies: blouses under lace-up dresses or gowns with head rings

Noblemen & Women: tunics and dresses with an under-dress, belted or tied at the waist with headdresses and cloaks.

Peasants: tattered shirts, straw hats, good luck charms, short tunics belted at the waist over short trousers or dresses over underskirts with cowls and boots

Jesters: brightly colored tunics, felt hats, tight
